

DATES ORIGINALS

Plants with compound (Bustle) leaves (the blade has one or two leaflets attached at the base of the blade on the back side; in some varieties the leaflet is like another leaf on the back of the blade which may be 1/2 to 3/4 as large as the blade). The blossoms are single and wasp type (two upper petals fluted up and backward, three lower petals deeply cut, reminiscent of individual petals).

- BLACK FRIAR -- Blossoms two-tone dark burgundy; leaves longifolia; the plant stems somewhat -- very unusual, recommended only as a collector's item.
- BLUE TAIL FLY -- Blossoms medium blue, and medium in size, but puts out many at a time. The foliage is soft, beautifully marked (S. velutina foliage); makes quite a large plant.
- CELERY ----- Blossoms a medium blue but distorted in shape. This plant is grown primarily for its unusual foliage which, as its name implies, is longifolia, and the base of the petiole will extend half way around the stem, which is elongated. ~~not compact like most violets.~~ The foliage with its unusual twists and shapes is very good for use in arrangements.
- DATES FANFARE -- Blossoms a medium blue, uniform in shape and held high above the plant. Foliage a medium green, grows symmetrically.
- DAVE MASTERSON WASP -- Blossoms medium blue. Foliage medium to dark green with some red underside, good symmetry.
- FIRE WASP ---- Blossoms red. Foliage dark green with dark red underside and petioles.
- HOOD WINK --- Blossoms medium blue with narrow white edge. Foliage medium green, light underside.
- KNIGHT LIGHT WASP --- Blossoms cupped and white. Foliage light green, with light underside.
- LOVERLY WASP -- Semi-miniature. Blossoms two-tone lavender, small. Foliage medium green. When grown under cool conditions, it will varigate. (A bustled sport of LOVERLY, discovered by Mrs. Tretter of St. Louis, MO).
- LUNAR LILY --- Blossoms pink and white. Foliage medium green, light underside.
- NYMPH FLY ---- Semi-miniature. Blossoms dark blue. Foliage dark green, with lighter green veins, red underside (S. velutina foliage).
- PINK FLY ---- Semi-miniature. Blossoms pink, a pink sport of NYMPH FLY; a real gem of a find.
- PINK WASP --- Our first release which established the compound foliage and wasp type bloom. Blossoms a strong, clear pink with a dark eye. Foliage standard quilted, dark green, medium green underside, occasionally tinged red.
- SPOOTNICK --- Semi-miniature. Blossoms two-tone lavender. Foliage medium green.
- WILL-O-THE WASP - Small grower. Blossoms rose pink with upper two petals and tips of other three a dark rose or cerise. Foliage dark green, with red underside.

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Plants with only an occasional compound leaf-sometimes none at all-with single wasp type blossoms.

- AEOLIAN WASP -- Blossoms large lush pink. Foliage medium green, compact and symmetrical. Will make a large plant at maturity and is an excellent show plant.
- BLUE WASP -- Blossoms medium blue. Foliage standard, medium green. Good symmetry.
- BURGUNDY WASP - Semi-miniature. Blossoms dark burgundy; with darker burgundy tips. Foliage dark green, red underside.
- CALICO WASP -- Blossoms lavender and purple fantasy. Foliage standard, medium green. Good symmetry.
- KRISTA LYNN -- Semi-miniature. Blossoms dark blue. Foliage deeply serrated, scalloped girl type.
- LITHE LASSIE -- Blossoms very soft pink, almost white. Foliage medium green.
- MERLIDA WASP -- Blossoms dark blue. Foliage dark green with red underside, long and slightly spooned, good symmetry.
- RACHEL ---- Blossoms medium blue, heavy bloomer. Foliage medium green, with some red to underside, round; a cross with S. orbicularis. Good symmetry.
- ROYAL WASP --- Blossoms huge dark purple blue. Foliage medium to dark green, depending on how much red shows up on the underside. Our royal choice because of the size and color of blooms.
- SAN FRANCISCO WASP -- Blossoms rose pink. Foliage medium green, good symmetry.
- SNOW WASP --- Blossoms white. Foliage frilled, light green and shiny.

Plants with only an occasional compound leaf-sometimes none at all-with single deep cut star blossoms (the almost separate petals are fluted, slightly fluted, or flat; of equal size all the way around).

- COOL HAND PINK -- Blossoms large strong clear pink, slightly fluted. Foliage standard medium green.
- CORAL SPIDER -- Semi-miniature. Blossoms deeply cut star, petals fluted, medium to dark green.
- DATES JUBILEE -- Blossoms white and pink fringed, slightly fluted. Foliage frilled, light to medium green with lighter underside.
- KANELAND BEAUTY -- Blossoms lavender blue and white, slightly fluted. Foliage semi-longfolia, slightly frilled, medium green.
- PEPPERMINT FROST -- Blossoms large semi-cupped, soft peppermint pink. Foliage medium green.
- PINK FINGERS --- Blossoms medium pink. Foliage medium to dark green, with some red underside; serrated edge. Good symmetry.

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Plants with compound foliage and double wasp type bloom (usually composed of large outside petals with many fluted petals in the center).

- LADY MOUNTBATTAN -- Blossoms a strong pink. Foliage medium green.

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Plants with only an occasional compound leaf - sometimes none at all - and double wasp type bloom.

- PINK CHERUBS -- Blossoms semi-double bright pink. Foliage dark green, red underside.
- PINK NOSEGAY -- Blossoms medium pink, each one resembling small nosegays (one large petal around the outside with the center filled with many fluted petals. Foliage medium green.
- ROYAL MOUNTBATTAN -- Blossoms dark blue. Foliage dark green, spooned and serrated. Grows very symmetrically.
- WHAM BANG --- Blossoms cerise red. Foliage dark green, serrated.

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Plants with standard foliage, blossoms single, standard dipped type (the upper two petals small and are dipped downward toward the center of the flower).

- BEACH COMBER -- Blossoms white with lavender-blue markings. Foliage elongated, slightly frilled, medium green.
- BLUE OWL --- Blossoms powder blue, extra large. Foliage slightly spooned, serrated, medium to dark green.
- PEEK-A-BOO -- Blossoms white with an occasional touch of blue. Foliage medium green, plain quilted.
- PINK OWL --- Blossoms medium to bright pink. Foliage elongated and pointed, dark green with red underside.
- PUPPY LOVE -- Blossoms powder blue. Foliage elongated and pointed, dark green with occasional red underside.
- SNOW OWL --- Blossoms white with a touch of blue. Foliage elongated and pointed, light green.

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Plants with standard foliage and blooms.

- BONNICE --- Blossoms huge lush pink star, occasionally semi-double, hold bell. Foliage dark green, shiny, quilted.
- DATES MYSTIQUE - Blossoms single, unusual mauve; flower stark dark reddish green. Foliage, quilted, shiny. A mature plant is quite large, flat, with good symmetry.
- EVAGENE --- Blossoms deep rose double, prolific bloomer. Foliage quilted, dark green. A fast growing show plant that shapes itself.
- FIRST RECITAL -- Semi-miniature. Blossoms single, lavender blue w/white fringed edge. Foliage is dark green, light underside, irregularly shaped, slightly turned up at the edges in places. Plant overall has good symmetry.
- HELEN K. --- Blossoms double bright pink. Foliage is medium to dark green (depending on amount of red underside), quilted and serrated.
- INTENSIFIED PRIDE - Blossoms single, deep cerise with light streaks in upper petals, like little ears. Foliage dark green, quilted.
- NANCY ANN --- Semi-miniature. Blossoms many small, single light blue. Foliage medium green standard.
- PINK PROLIFITY - Blossoms double light pink with darker eye; heavy bloomer. Foliage medium green, quilted. Makes a good show plant.
- TIE-DYED --- Blossoms double rose red center, wide white fringed edge tinged with green. Foliage dark green, frilled.
- ZURI ---- Blossoms single, lavender mauve. Foliage Clackamas Rattler type. Small grower.
